Clerk Report March 9th 2021

CBC have agreed to repair the sensor light on the front door of the CBC office which hopefully may be of some help with the litter issue being caused by the use of the steps as a meeting place during the evenings. With regards to the two bins on the Square CBC waste have again confirmed their intention to remove the bin that is detached from the paving and re-instate the one that still has the paving stone attached and will do so as soon as resources allow.

It may have been noticed in some Social media posts making reference to one local town receiving 'dedicated officers' to work in and around the town. I have made enquiries on this and copy the response from Cumbria Constabulary below;

Hi Steve, It is something that we have put in place for the Millom area due to them being so far away from the Whitehaven deployment centre. The officers still start and finish in Whitehaven still but are dedicated to that sole area. Whilst Millom is the main town in the area that they cover, the reality is that they actually have coverage from south of Gosforth. To some degree it is linked to the uplift in police numbers which has allowed us to provide this enhanced coverage without significant risk to patrol requirements in the rest of Copeland. Currently we are not in a position to offer the same to other areas of Copeland but if this changes then I will ensure that sufficient representation is made for the other towns in the area. Unfortunately I do not have costings associated with it.

A resident from Cleator has been in touch regarding a potential issue with a tree opposite his garden which backs onto the River Ehen. I have discussed this with Environmental health and have now passed the questions to CBC planning dept to establish the current position regarding any preservation orders that may be in place and allow a way forward for the resident and landowner to agree.

A Cumbria Waste Management wheely bin has been in position outside the former Private Nursery on Ennerdale Road, the bin has been getting used to drop of items and has also been used for dog waste, after discussions with CWM this bin has now been uplifted.

Litter and waste continues to be an issue for many towns with the amount of available bins appearing to have little effect on the problem, indeed one of the main causes of litter is now from cars with the growing prevalence of takeaway and convenience foods. I am awaiting details from the request to CBC regarding enforcement but it may be that a working group be set up to discuss ideas with business and residents that may help with this problem. Litter picks are a good help and more than appreciated but they are not the solution, engagement with the community including schools

and business' with a view to educate and promote a 'Tidy Town' may be something that we could work from, maybe a Town catchphrase could be used. "Litter, Its not just a throw away remark'. Maybe we could get a celebrity football manager to say 'Its too easy just to throw it away' any suggestions.

Dog waste is also still a massive issue and it is hoped something can be achieved here when we get some further information from enforcement.

The Big Hill bin is not back in place and looking back to the report on this bin from January 2017 the report states that the bin will be repaired as well as is possible but due to the continued damage it will probably not be able to repair and return it to shape again should future damage occur. The bin has been repaired once more since then the repair was not to the actual structure but to the fixing. The feeling of the waste team is that this bin is now beyond any further repair. Thought needs to be given to the positioning of the bin in general at this location with repairs having been paid for several times in the last few years due to continued damage.

Fly tipping continues to be an issue and figures show that incidents across Copeland continue to rise. We have another incident on the land beside the path from the Big Hill to St Marys church and currently attempts are being made to locate the source, it has been suggested that this is private land and up to the owner however this problem in this location has occurred three other times within the last eighteen months the cost of clearing falling to the Town Council twice and CCC once. This and the rubbish at the Big Hill will be removed however in the case of the land next to the path I will continue efforts to find the source of the problem.

Reports have also been received today of building waste being dumped on Fletcher Street which I will look into now to establish the exact location and ownership, the initial report suggests it may be housing association land.

On request CBC have removed more fly tipping from the pavement behind high street. I will now make enquiries as to whether enforcement can discuss this with some of the residents that appear to be causing the rubbish to gather.

On a brighter note the Flower bed dedication to the NHS is still in place and will be planted up again for the summer.

Details of the proposal to lease the 'park at the junction with William Morris and Ennerdale road to accommodate the W4U allotment programme have been circulated, as stated it will be publicised to allow for any public comments. On the whole this would seem to be a sensible solution enabling this project to get started and stay in town, the position of the land could not be better for W4U and as also stated public access will remain for the duration of the project whilst bringing the land back into use, timescales are tight for this project and the necessary funding. Receipt of the info did not give enough time to add to the agenda. I can however draft a response for the landowner and would ask members to let me have any thoughts on the project.
